SOUL vs. BRIGADE

GAME PREVIEW: WEEK 4

PHILADELPHIA - The Philadelphia Soul (2-0) look to remain undefeated this weekend as they host the Baltimore Brigade (1-1) on Saturday, April 29 for the team's home opener, presented by Independence Blue Cross. The night will begin at 6:30 p.m. with a special pre-game ceremony celebrating the 2016 championship season and the game will kick off at 7pm. The game will be broadcast live on CBS Sports Network and 97.5 The Fanatic.

This will be the first time in Arena Football history that these two teams will face each other. The Soul will try to defend their perfect record, while the Brigade are eager for another win after defeating the Cleveland Gladiators in Week 2.

The first match-up to look out for is between Soul WR Sean "SK" Kauleinamoku and Brigade DB Varmah Sonie. SK is off to a strong start this year as he leads his team with 17 receptions for 174 yards and two touchdowns. However, he and the other Soul receivers must watch out for DB Varmah Sonie. In just two games, he has tallied 12.0 total tackles, four pass breakups, and four passes defended.

The next match-up to check out is between Soul DB James Romain and Brigade WR Reggie Gray. Romain has, and continues to be an enormous threat on defense. Romain has 11.5 total tackles, two pass breakups, three passes defended, and one interception for 34 yards this season. Finding opening in the backfield will be a challenge for even a talent like WR Reggie Gray. In two games, Gray has tallied 22 receptions for 231 yards and four TD's.

Lastly, QB Dan Raudabaugh will face off against Brigade QB Shane Carden. So far this season, Raudabaugh has completed 45-of-67 attempted passes and 10 TD's. He ranks high among the league's QBs with a 114% QB rating. Carden has completed 41-of-67 passes and nine TD's. His QB rating is 96.4%. Their similar stats will make things interesting for this historic matchup.

OPPOSING PLAYERS TO WATCH

QB Shane Carden— In his first season of AFL football, Carden has completed 41-of-67 passes for 356 yards and nine touchdowns so far this season.

WR Reggie Gray— The leading receiver has caught 22 passes for 231 yards and four touchdowns so far with the Brigade.

DB Varmah Sonie- Leads the Brigade defense with 12.0 total tackles, four pass break-ups and four passes defended.

THE SERIES

This is the first time in AFL history that the Soul and the Brigade will match-up.

The Soul will travel to Cleveland to face the Gladiators for the first time this season on Friday, May 5 at 7 p.m.

THE COACHES

PHILADELPHIA SOUL HEAD COACH CLINT DOLEZEL

Clint Dolezel is entering his fifth season as Head Coach of the Philadelphia Soul. In his four years as head coach, the Soul boast a record of 51-21 (.708 winning percentage) including a 16-3 record in 2016, an ArenaBowl Championship and earned him Coach of the Year honors. With Dolezel at the helm, the team has made the playoffs all four seasons, won the east division title twice and made three American Conference Championship game appearances. In 2013, his first season as head coach, the team won the American Conference Championship and appeared in the ArenaBowl in 2013.

Dolezel spent 2012 as the Offensive Coordinator of the Philadelphia Soul, where the team shattered offensive scoring records... 1,228 points for a 68.2 average per game. The team also set a record for most points by a visiting team in a 92-42 victory over the Georgia Force. Wide receiver Tiger Jones received second team All-Arena honors under Dolezel's direction in 2012.

Dolezel began his coaching career with the af2's Florida Firecats as their Offensive Coordinator in 2009. In 2010, he landed his first professional head coaching position with the San Angelo Stampede (IFL) and guided them to the second round of the playoffs. In 2011, Dolezel was tabbed as head coach of the AFL's Dallas Vigilantes and made the playoffs with an 11-7 regular-season record and a playoff appearance in his rookie head coaching season.

VS. THE BRIGADE

This will be the first time Soul head coach Clint Dolezel faces the Baltimore Brigade.

BALTIMORE BRIGADE HEAD COACH OMARR SMITH

Arena Football Hall of Famer Omarr Smith was the head coach of the LA KISS during the 2016 season where his team earned a home playoff appearance while ending the regular season ranked second in the National Conference. Prior to leading the LA KISS, Smith served as the assistant head coach for the San Jose SaberCats for two seasons and helped lead the team to an ArenaBowl Championship in 2015. He was also a member of the Arizona Rattlers as defensive coordinator for four seasons and was named the AFL's Assistant Coach of the Year in 2013. In 2012 and 2013, the Rattlers won consecutive Championships with a defense ranked second in points allowed per game every season Smith led the defensive unit. Smith is one of the most successful players and coaches in AFL history, earning a combined seven AFL championships. During his nine-year playing career, he won four ArenaBowl titles (2002,2003, 2004, 2007), and ended his career with 35 interceptions, 88 pass breakups and eight defensive touchdowns. As an assistant coach, he won three ArenaBowl titles, one with San Jose and two with Arizona. The Torrance, Calif., native graduated from San Jose State University and is ranked second on the school's list in career interceptions (13).

VS. THE SOUL

Coach Smith has a 0-2 record against the Soul in his career. The last time he faced the Soul was as the head coach of the LA KISS in 2016. The Soul won 73-37 in Week 11.

LEADING HIS TEAM: QB Dan Raudabaugh has led the Soul to three East Division Championships (2012-13, 2015) and an ArenaBowl XXIX Championship. Last season, he completed 339-of-490 passes for 4,303 yards and 101 touchdowns. He was awarded Second Team All-Arena for the 2016 season. In 2015, he threw 4,992 yards and 119 touchdowns with a QB rating of 122.39. Raudabaugh was awarded the AFL MVP, First Team All-Arena, and *Russell* Offensive Player of the Year award in the 2015 season. So far this season he threw 45-67-2 for 504 yards and 10 touchdowns.

THEY CALL HIM MONEY: WR Darius Reynolds will suit up in with the Soul gear for the second year. After a successful 2015 season, "Money" Reynolds is on a mission to help win another Philadelphia Championship. Last year, Reynolds made a huge impact for the Soul offense with 112 receptions for 1147 and 38 touchdowns in his first year with the team. Prior to his career in Philadelphia, he played for the Iowa Barnstomers and the San Jose SaberCats. In two games, he tallied 11 receptions for 154 yards. He leads the team in receiving touchdowns with six in just two games.

ARENABOWL XXIX MVP: WR Sean Kauleinamoku, better known to the team as "SK", will be entering his third year with the Soul in 2017. This ArenaBowl MVP tallied 99 receptions for 1,304 yards and 26 touchdowns last year. The team is happy to have him back as they try to duplicate last year's championship run. In his first two games of 2017, SK has recorded 17 receptions for 174 yards and two touchdowns.

RECEIVERS BEWARE: DB James Romain posed as large threat last season as one of the league's top defensive backs. Last season, Romain had five interceptions for 47 yards and one touchdown. He also had 45.0 tackles and 18 pass breakups. In his first two games of the 2017 season, Romain had 11.5 tackles, one interception for 34 yards, two pass breakup, and three passes defended.

TAMPA BAY— The Philadelphia Soul (1-0) defeated the Tampa Bay Storm (1-1), with the final score 56-52 in front of 9,071 fans at the Amalie Arena in Tampa, FL on Saturday night.

Soul WR Darius Reynolds led the receivers with five receptions for 78 yards and three touchdowns. WR Ryan McDaniel added nine receptions for 87 yards and one touchdown and WR Shaun Kauleinamoku tallied five receptions for 49 yards. Tampa Bay WR Kendrick Ings led the Storm receivers with seven receptions for 137 yards and two touchdowns.

Philadelphia QB Dan Raudabaugh completed 22-of-31 passes for 257 yards and five touchdowns. Tampa Bay QB Randy Hippeard completed 20-of-33 passes for 292 yards and six touchdowns.

The Soul won the coin toss and elected to kick off to the Storm. During the Storm's first drive, Hippeard's pass was intercepted by DB James Romain. The Soul took over and quickly reacted with a 19-yard pass from Raudabaugh to WR Ryan McDaniel for a touchdown. Trevino's kick was no good and with 9:40 to play in the first quarter, the Soul led 6-0. The Storm responded with a 6-yard touchdown pass from Hippeard to WR LaMark Brown. Extra point was good and with 6:00 to play, the Soul trailed 7-6. The Soul did not hesitate and Raudabaugh found WR Chris Duvalt for a 27-yard touchdown. The extra point was good and the Soul regained the lead 13-7. On the kick-off, Storm WR Kendrick Ings returned the kick for a touchdown. With the missed extra point and 3:10 to go, the Soul were tied 13-13. Raudabaugh connected with WR Darius Reynolds for his first touchdown of the night on a 35-yard pass. Kick was good and the Soul took the lead, 20-13 at the end of the first quarter.

The Storm started off the second quarter with a 39-yard touchdown pass from Hippeard to WR Justin Hilton. The kick was no good and the Soul remained in the lead 20-19. On the next drive, Raudabaugh was sacked by DL Jordan Miller and fumbled, also recovered by Miller. The Storm took advantage and Hippeard found Brown for a 9-yard touchdown. A bad snap caused K Mark Lewis to throw for the two-point conversion and his pass was intercepted by Soul DB Torez Jones for a two-point defensive touchdown, decreasing the Storm lead 25-22. In the final minute of play, Raudabaugh handed off to FB Mykel Benson for a 1-yard touchdown and at the end of the first half, the Soul led 29-25.

The Soul slowly started off the third quarter with a 2-yard touchdown run by Benson. Trevino's kick was good and with 6:44 to play in the third quarter, the Soul led 36-25. The Storm responded with a 6-yard touchdown run by Hippeard and with a failed two-point conversion, the Soul kept their lead 36-31 for the end of the quarter.

To kick off the final quarter, Raudabaugh passed to Reynolds for his second touchdown of the night. With the made extra point and 10:13 to play, the Soul widened the lead 43-31. Hippeard connected with Ings for 45 yards and even with the extra point, the Soul remained in the lead, 43-38. Reynolds caught his third touchdown of the night on a 2-yard pass. Kick was no good and with 2:55 left in the game, the Soul were leading 49-38. The battle continued as Hippeard found Ings for another Storm touchdown and a successful two-point conversion closed the gap 49-46. Lewis attempted the onside kick but was recovered by Reynolds for a Soul touchdown. With 57 seconds to play, the Soul led 56-46. The Storm would not give up as Hippeard found Hills for two yards and the team's final touchdown of the night. The two-point conversion was good but at the end of the game, the Soul took the win 56-52.

WASHINGTON— The Philadelphia Soul (2-0) defeated the Washington Valor (1-1), with the final score 49-31 in front of 12,122 fans at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C. on Saturday night.

Soul WR Shaun Kauleinamoku led the receivers with 12 receptions for 125 yards and two touchdowns. WR Darius Reynolds added six receptions for 76 yards and three touchdowns and WR Ryan McDaniel tallied five receptions for 46 yards. Washington WR Mike Washington led the Valor receivers with nine receptions for 125 yards and two touchdowns.
